HAAP is the process Howard uses to assess academic and administrative units for continuous improvement.

HAAP is centered around a basic assessment process that includes creating outcomes, identifying measures to assess those outcomes, implementing your plan, reporting the results from implementation, and including tangible action items to start the cycle for the next academic year.

Institutional Data


IRA developed theInstitutional Dashboard to share with departments data including application, admission, enrollment, retention, and graduation rates over the past five academic years.


Snapshots of Fall 2022 Institutional Dashboard
